



Light can't travel through most objects e.g. doors/walls/people. Light hits off the object which causes a shadow.</p> <p>Light can travel through some things, like windows and cling film. They are both <u>transparent</u> (see-through). Can you think of anything else that is transparent?</p> <p><u>Look at the pictures on page 5 which will show you how to make your own shadow puppet!</u></p>
<p><b>PE:</b> Choose your favourite type of race (egg and spoon, two-legged, wheelbarrow, sack race) OR create your own race. Challenge someone at home to race you, or time how long it takes you!</p>	<p><b>SPHE</b></p> <p>Make a poster to inform people how to wash their hands correctly. 


1. Draw a head and attached arm.




2. Continue the body and legs below.




3. Draw the other head and attached arm.

8. Trace again to thicken, and add spots.





9. Color with solid bright colors.




